I. Verb conjugation

1. Please conjugate the verb *eo, ire, ii, itum*, in the pluperfect active indicative.

2. Please conjugate the verb *interficio, interficere, interfeci, interfectum* in the imperfect active subjunctive.

II. Noun/adjective declension

1. Please decline the noun-adjective phrase *rus gratum* in all singular and plural forms.

2. Please decline the noun-adjective phrase *arbor pristina* in all singular and plural forms.

III. Translation: please translate the following sentences from Latin to English or English to Latin as appropriate.

1. Mercatore* in foro multas res civibus vendente**, uxor eius in domo cum amicis loquebatur.

2. Julius Caesar, who was a great Roman, led an army to Gaul in order to conquer the barbarians.

3. Illa domus, quae a meo amico empta est***, tam parva est ne stare possimus in ea.

4.Civibus Romanis per ambitionem aliasque culpas corruptis, Res Publica infirma facta est.

5.Quaeram te, Domine, ut vivat anima mea.

6.Cum ego familiam uxoris meae in Roma visitarem, Caesarem et Catonem**, de quibus pater meus mihi prius dixerat, ad forum ambulantes saepe vidi.**

7.Ilio tempore nos ad theatrum cotidie venimus causa audiendi actores in illo loco recitantes opera poetarum Graecorum.

8.Nolite audire eum, liberi; scio eum esse malum virum et infidelem civitati nostrae.
